CLASS H HORSES, MULES & PONIES GENERAL RULES

A liability waiver must be signed by a parent or legal guardian before an exhibitor may compete. Waivers will be available at check-in.

Any animal exhibited must be owned or leased by the exhibitor. An animal may be jointly owned with members of the exhibitor's immediate family. No animal may be substituted for the animal on file after May 1. In the case of illness or death of the animal a substitute will be permitted upon approval of the superintendent.

Each animal must be entered and shown by only one exhibitor. Each animal may show only once in each class.

Each animal shown must be two years old by May 1.

No stallions are allowed.

All entries must be in the proper class or they will be disqualified.

Junior Division: 8 to 13 years old as of Sept. 1, 2004. Senior Division: 14 years old as of Sept. 1, 2004.

An exhibitor may show up to **two animals per show**. Example: 2 ponies, 2 horses or 2 mules or a combination of horse, pony or mule. See "Horse, Mule and Pony Classes", for a list of two animal classes.

An exhibitor may enter 2 same sex animals or 2 ponies in the appropriate halter classes. Another 4-H member may show the second animal.

The following will apply and be enforced:

Pony height is 56 inches.

Only junior exhibitors are allowed to show ponies in pony classes.

Senior exhibitors who wish to show a pony must show it in the horse/mule classes.

Dress requirements are as follows: HALTER AND PERFORMANCE EVENTS; Western style long pants, western style long sleeved shirt, western hat, western boots with a heel. A coat, vest, jacket, gloves, chaps and spurs are optional, chaps and spurs are prohibited in halter and showmanship classes. **The Exhibitor may wear a riding helmet in any class.** SPEED EVENTS: Long pants, collared short sleeved shirt (no sleeveless or T-shirts will be allowed), and western boots with a heel. No hats or caps may be worn. All rules and patterns will be posted the day of the show.

All exhibitors must check in at the registration table between 7 a.m.-8 a.m. There will be no late check-ins.

Assigned exhibitor numbers must be displayed appropriately in every class.

An exhibitor's carriage of free hand is optional. However, it may not touch tack or the animal in pleasure classes.

Bits must be appropriate for age of animal. Animals age 5 and under may be shown in a hackamore or snaffle. Animals 6 years or older must be shown in a bit (with shanks) in all performance classes.

All exhibitors must display sportsmanship throughout the show. Cruelty to or rough handling of an animal will result in disqualification. This includes whipping or hitting in front of the saddle.

Superintendents may dismiss any horse and/or exhibitor that they deem too dangerous.

State Law for all equine participating in an advertised event required a current negative Coggins test.

*Show in one class only.

Patterns for Showmanship, Horsemanship and Trail may be obtained prior to the show. Please contact Lisa Miller at 217-536-5615.

A complete set of rules will be posted the day of the show.

There will be a Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion All-Around Award in both divisions. Mare Halter, Gelding Halter and Pony Halter are the only classes that do not count toward All-Around Points.

Showmanship and Horsemanship are Award only classes.

There is no entry fee in these classes.

No premiums will be paid for these classes.

 - Animals originated from certified herd and were included in last herd test, and certified herd number and date of last test within 12 months, OR
 - Officially vaccinated animals under 24 months of age are required to be tested if health certificate lists record of vaccination.
 - Steers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
 - All brucellosis tests for Illinois State Fair shall be conducted at a State or Federal Laboratory.
- Registration papers showing ownership in member's name will be required of all animals shown in the purebred classes.
 - Entries in cow classes must have been the property of the exhibitor since December 31, 2004. All animals that have freshened must show in cow class. All cows three years and over must have produced a calf.
 - Entries in calf and yearling classes must have been the property of the exhibitor and a part of his project by June 1, 2005.
 - A Junior Heifer Calf is dropped after March 1, 2005 (Holstein Only).
 - An Intermediate Heifer Calf is dropped December 1, 2004 - February 28, 2005 (Holstein Only).
 - A Senior Heifer Calf is an animal dropped between September 1, 2004 and November 30, 2004.
 - A Summer Yearling Heifer is an animal dropped between June 1, 2004 and August 31, 2004.
 - A Junior Yearling Heifer is an animal dropped between March 1, 2004 and May 31, 2004.
 - An Intermediate Yearling Heifer is an animal dropped between December 1, 2003 and February 28, 2004.

Illinois Sheep

Health certificates will not be required for Illinois origin sheep. It is expected that the health certificates will be replaced by additional physical observation of the sheep for visible evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. Any animal which shows lesions of contagious ecthyme (sore mouth) may not be exhibited and must be removed from the exhibition area.

All sheep must be in place by noon Saturday, August 6 and released at noon Tuesday, August 9. All pens must be cleaned by midnight August 9.

Market Lambs to be sold at the 4-H Auction may stay until after the Auction on Thursday.

1. All lambs must be docked.
2. All lambs must have been dropped after September 1, 2004.
3. Market lambs may be purebred, crossbred or grade. They may be either wethers or ewes. Rams cannot be shown in market class.
4. Registration papers showing ownership in the member's name must be presented for purebred sheep.
5. A ewe lamb that is shown in the breeding class cannot be shown in the market class or vice versa.
6. Ewe and ram lambs and market lambs must have been owned by the exhibitor since June 25, 2005.

WILL BE SHOWN WITH CLASS A BEEF

An emergency regulation has been approved by the Advisory Board of livestock commissioners, which eliminates all tuberculin testing requirements for cattle being exhibited in Illinois that originate from a Bovine Tuberculosis Accredited - Free State. Since Illinois is a Bovine Tuberculosis Accredited - Free State, this means that Illinois cattle may be exhibited in Illinois shows without tuberculin tests. No tuberculin test is required for steers and females in market classes provided they are not co-mingled with breeding animals being exhibited.

Brucellosis

1. Applies to females and bulls over 6 months of age:
 - a. Negative brucellosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition OR
 - b. Animals originated from a certified brucellosis-free county, the herd or origin had no reactors on last complete herd test, and the animals for exhibition were negative to brucellosis test within 12 months, OR
 - c. Animals originated from certified herd and were included in last herd test, and certified herd number and date of last test are listed on health certificate OR
 - d. Officially vaccinated animals under 24 months of age are not required to be tested if health certificate lists record of vaccination.
2. Steers are not required to be tested for brucellosis. All brucellosis tests for Illinois State Fair shall be conducted at a State or Federal laboratory.

CLASS H BEEF RULES

1. A baby beef is a steer calved in the calendar year of 2004. In case there is a question as to the age eligibility of a steer, age shall be determined by a grievance committee. Over-aged animals shall be disqualified.
2. Dairy steer (100% dairy, no beef crosses) is a steer calved in the calendar year of 2004. In case there is a question as to the eligibility of a steer, age shall be determined by a grievance committee. Over-aged animals will be disqualified. Dairy steers will be shown after beef classes.
3. Baby beef steers will be weighed at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, August 6, and will be divided evenly into four divisions by weight, by the superintendent and auction chairman. Each exhibitor must be responsible for his market animal (steer) to be weighed at the designated time.
4. Each exhibitor will be limited to show two breeds of breeding stock.
5. All beef cattle must be in place by Friday, August 5, at 9:00 p.m.

CLASS H SWINE RULES

Illinois Swine

Accompanied by health certificate issued within 90 days prior to exhibition. Swine shall be individually identified by metal ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. Ear notch identification is acceptable only for animals accompanied by breed registration certificate. Health certificate shall show:

Brucellosis:

- a. Breeding swine, 4 months of age and over including females in market classes, not segregated from other breeding swine, to be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 90 days prior to exhibition. OR that the swine originated from a validated brucellosis free herd and validated herd number and validation date are listed on health certificate. Brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a State or Federal laboratory.
- b. Barrows and females in market classes shall be accompanied by a health certificate and shall be individually identified, but are exempt from brucellosis requirements.

Pseudorabies:

- a. Breeding swine to be negative to aserum neutralization (SN) for pseudorabies conducted with 90 days prior to exhibition AND that the herd of origin has not been under quarantine for pseudorabies during the preceding 12 months.
- b. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine EXCEPT for those at terminal shows that do not commingle with breeding swine in which case they may be exempt from pseudorabies test requirements.

1. All swine exhibited in the division must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2005.
2. All swine must be owned by exhibitor by June 1, 2005.
3. Swine entered in this division must be purebred and registered in the name of the exhibitor only, except that barrows shown in the litter must be owned by the exhibitor. The exhibitor shall present evidence that they are a part of a litter shown. All animals shall be plainly earmarked and these earmarks will be inspected to determine if they agree with those in the registration papers of the animals exhibited.
4. Each exhibitor must be responsible for his market animal (barrow to be weighed at the designated time.)
5. Barrow Class weights may be altered by superintendent to balance classes.
6. No gilts will be shown in the swine market class.
7. Each exhibitor will be permitted to show only two (2) breeds of breeding stock, but barrows can be of any combination of breeds. An exhibitor may show both juniors and seniors in a breed.
8. Each exhibitor showing boars shall furnish his or her own hurdles.
9. A crossbred gilt is an offspring from two or more different breeds. Maternal line gilt is an offspring of 2 or more breeds for mothering ability.
10. An individual may show a total of two animals in any weight class, with a maximum of four animals in barrow show.
11. A spring gilt is an animal farrowed on or after January 1, 2005.
12. A crossbred and maternal spring gilt is an animal farrowed on or after January 1, 2005.
13. A spring boar is an animal farrowed on or after January 1, 2005.
14. A limit of eighteen (18) animals per exhibition.
15. Animals must be in place by 10 a.m. Sunday, August 7, and will be released after the auction.
16. Weigh barrows and crossbred gilts Sunday, August 7. Weigh-in starts at 11:00 a.m.
17. An exhibitor may show only 2 animals in crossbred gilt and maternal gilt class with a maximum of three (3) gilts exhibited.
18. Crossbred gilts must be weighed.
