WILL BE SHOWN WITH CLASS A BEEF

An emergency regulation has been approved by the Advisory Board of livestock commissioners, which eliminates all tuberculin testing requirements for cattle being exhibited in Illinois that originate from a Bovine Tuberculosis Accredited - Free State. Since Illinois is a Bovine Tuberculosis Accredited - Free State, this means that Illinois cattle may be exhibited in Illinois shows without tuberculin tests. No tuberculin test is required for steers and females in market classes provided they are not co-mingled with breeding animals being exhibited.

CLASS H BEEF RULES

1. A baby beef is a steer calved in the calendar year of prior year. In case there is a question as to the age eligibility of a steer, age shall be determined by a grievance committee. Over-aged animals shall be disqualified.
2. Dairy steer (100% dairy, no beef crosses) is a steer calved in the calendar year of prior year. In case there is a question as to the eligibility of a steer, age shall be determined by a grievance committee. Over-aged animals will be disqualified. Dairy steers will be shown after beef classes.
3. Baby beef steers will be weighed at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, and will be divided evenly into four divisions by weight, by the superintendent and auction chairman. Each exhibitor must be responsible for his market animal (steer) to be weighed at the designated time.
4. Each exhibitor will be limited to show two breeds of breeding stock.
5. **All beef cattle must be in place by Friday at 5 p.m. and released Monday at 5 p.m.**
6. Bring generators if possible

ALL poultry entries (except ducks, geese, pigeons and doves) MUST have a negative pullorum-typhoid test or a certificate from the breeder/ hatchery stating the stock originated from a U.S. pullorum-typhoid clean flock BEFORE admission to the poultry area. A poultry tester will be available first Saturday at 8 a.m.
2. A Wild Game permit is required for game birds. (Pheasants & Quail, etc.) Obtain from Illinois Department of Conservation.
3. All poultry must be owned by exhibitor by June 1. (Excluding Broiler/Fryer Market).
4. All chickens must be in place Saturday at 8 a.m., and released at 8 a.m. Chickens must be out of cages and cleaned by Tuesday at 10 a.m.
5. A member may show only one entry in each market class. Example: One Broiler/Fryer Market Pen and One Roaster Market Pen. All other classes are two entries per class.
6. A young chicken is hatched in current year.
7. A old chicken is hatched before current year.
8. Old pair hatched in prior year. Young pair hatched in prior year. A pair is one male and one female.
9. A broiler/fryer market pen consists of three cockerels or three pullets of the same breed each weighing under four pounds.
10. A roaster market pen consists of three cockerels or three pullets of the same breed each weighing over four pounds.
11. Coops are furnished. Members must bring feed and water containers. Bird cages must be cleaned under daily.
12. Must meet all 4-H General Rules of Effingham County.

Brucellosis

Applies to females and bulls over 6 months of age:

- a. Negative brucellosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition, OR
- b. Animals originated from a certified brucellosis-free county, the herd of origin had no reactors on last complete herd test, and the animals for exhibition were negative to brucellosis test within 12 months, OR
- c. Animals originated from certified herd and were included in last herd test, and certified herd number and date of last test within 12 months, OR
- d. Officially vaccinated animals under 24 months of age are required to be tested if health certificate lists record of vaccination.
- e. Steers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- f. All brucellosis tests for Illinois State Fair shall be conducted at a State or Federal Laboratory.

1. Registration papers showing ownership in member's name will be required of all animals shown in the purebred classes.
2. Entries in cow classes must have been the property of the exhibitor since December 31, 2015. All animals that have freshened must show in cow class. All cows three years and over must have produced a calf.

CLASS H HORSES,

A liability waiver must be signed by a parent or legal guardian before an exhibitor may compete. Waivers will be available at check-in.

Any animal exhibited must be owned or leased by the exhibitor. An animal may be jointly owned with members of the exhibitor's immediate family. In the case of illness or death of the animal a substitute will be permitted upon approval of the superintendent.

Each animal must be entered and shown by only one exhibitor. Each animal may show only once in each class.

Each animal shown must be two years old by May 1, current year.

No stallions or jacks are allowed.

All entries must be in the proper class or they will be disqualified.

Junior Division: 8 to 13 years old as of Sept. 1. Senior Division: 14 years old as of Sept. 1.

An exhibitor may show up to **two animals per show.** Example: 2 ponies, 2 horses or 2 mules or a combination of horse, pony or mule. See Horse entry form for a list of two animal classes.

An exhibitor may enter 2 same sex animals in the appropriate halter classes. Another exhibitor may show the second animal.

Dress requirements are as follows: HALTER AND PERFORMANCE EVENTS; Western style long pants, western style long sleeved shirt, western hat, western boots with a heel. A coat, vest, jacket, gloves, chaps and spurs are optional, chaps and spurs are prohibited in halter and showmanship classes. **Approved riding helmet required for all Exhibitors in all mounted classes.** SPEED EVENTS: Long pants, collared short sleeved shirt (no sleeveless or T-shirts will be allowed), and western boots with a heel. No hats or caps may be worn. All rules and patterns will be posted the day of the show.

Assigned exhibitor numbers must be displayed appropriately in every class.

An exhibitor's carriage of free hand is optional. However, it may not touch tack or the animal in pleasure classes.

Bits must be appropriate for age of animal. Animals age 5 and under may be shown in a hackamore or snaffle. Animals 6 years or older must be shown in a bit (with shanks) in all performance classes.

All exhibitors must display sportsmanship throughout the show. Cruelty to or rough handling of an animal will result in disqualification. This includes whipping or hitting in front of the saddle.

For safety purposes, horses will be required to walk into and out of the arena. Any exhibitor running through the gate will be automatically disqualified. Once inside the arena, the horse and rider may circle once before beginning a run.

Exhibitor number must be worn on the backside of exhibitor or attached to each side of saddle pad or tack. Except for in-hand classes one number shall be worn on the exhibitor's back.

Superintendents may dismiss any horse and/or exhibitor that they deem too dangerous.

State Law for all equine participating is an advertised event required a current negative Coggins test.

Patterns for Showmanship, Horsemanship and Trail may be obtained prior to the show. Please contact Dana Grupe.

Illinois Swine

Accompanied by health certificate issued within 90 days prior to exhibition. Swine shall be individually identified by metal ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. Ear notch identification is acceptable only for animals accompanied by breed registration certificate. Health certificate shall show:

1. All gilts exhibited in the division must have been farrowed on or after January 1, current year, barrows January 15, current year
2. All swine must be owned by exhibitor by June 1, current year.
3. All purebred gilts entered must be registered in the name of the exhibitor only. All animals exhibited shall be plainly ear marked and these ear marks will be inspected.
4. Each exhibitor must be responsible for his market animal (barrow to be weighed at the designated time.)
5. Barrow Class weights may be altered by superintendent to balance classes. .
6. No gilts will be shown in the market barrow class.
7. **The show is open only to Effingham County.**
9. ONLY two (2) barrows may show in each division, not including carcass barrow.
10. Weigh barrows and cross bred gilts Saturday, weigh in TBA.
11. An individual may show a total of two (2) gilts in each class (purebred, maternal, and market).
